Bridging the disciplinary divide: New routes to understanding the South African past?

BRIEF OVERVIEW

Are there different routes to comprehending the South African past?

To what extent are the conventional practices in historical research relevant to our understanding of the complex past issues facing South African society? And, how do we engage with those views in the present and the future?

Is it not time for historians of culture, society, identity, politics, economics, philosophy, the environment, warfare and the self, to collectively engage in discussion? Would it not also be worth engaging with intellectual historians and historians of science?

Collaboratively they may be in a favourable position to deliberate with historically engaged scholars in fields related, or far distant, from historical studies.

Is there a need for historians to move out of their comfort zone? Or does the discipline have sufficient resilience to stand the test of time and still prove itself useful in the era of 21st century

globalisation, increasing communication, social networking and virtual (spatial) and temporal consciousness.

How does history stand up to the test of time in comprehending contemporary challenges of realtime change and the demand of society for providing an account of how we have reached the point we are at in the present?

Historians, as well as specialists in in a variety of related study fields are constantly faced with reframing the past to provide lucid insights on the present and the future.

A salient theme of the conference is to contemplate strategies to engage with new and different views of the past.

It would also be worthwhile securing participation from non-historians working in disciplines, foreign to history.

A critical engagement could lead to new insights and potential collaboration that could lead to bridging the disciplinary divide.

Above all, for those adventurous spirits who would like to experiment in the field of history, there should be an opportunity to share their views.

The conference is, above all, an opportunity for historians who specialise in multi-facetted and varied fields of South Africa's past to continue their deliberations and engagement in an atmosphere conducive to fine academic discourse.

Apart from the leading question posed the conference will address a range of critically important themes in the various history related fields.
